

# Grains

Dry conditions continue to cause challenges for the U.S. spring wheat crop. As of July 9th, just 35% of the spring wheat crop was rated in either good or excellent condition, the lowest for the date since 1988. High protein spring wheat supplies could be especially limited during the next year which may cause prices to rise.
